

University of Essex Women in STEM Scholarship 2025-26

The Women in STEM scholarship programme, funded by the British Council, provides funding for women from eligible countries to complete a one-year master's degree in the UK.

The scholarship is intended to cover all costs (up to approved limits for each element) associated with the programme study including:

Type of award	Funding available
	 Tuition fees for one-year taught masters course only. Up to 12-months monthly stipend at the rate of £1,603 per month to cover costs of living, including accommodation.
	 *IELTS exam fee (for scholars without a valid test of English). *Return economy-class travel from home country to UK.
Full-funding award	 *Study-related costs, such as essential travel, materials, equipment, thesis printing etc.
	Visa application fees.NHS surcharge
	 *Ad hoc costs (heavy baggage allowance, etc.) *Please note evidence will be required for these expenses

Terms and conditions

Eligibility

- Be a passport holder and permanent resident of Mexico
- Be a self-funded* female** overseas fee payer

*Students receiving a repayable loan to fund their studies will be considered as self-funded.

**Please note this scholarship is open for women and anyone identifying as a woman

- Hold an offer (conditional or unconditional) to start a one-year full time masters degree on one of the following courses within the Department of Government, School of Health and Community Services, School of Life Sciences, School of Computer Science and Electronic Engineering, School of Mathematics, Statistics and Actuarial Science, starting in October 2025.
 - MSc Environmental Futures with Climate Change
 - Master of Global Public Health
 - MSc Biotechnology
 - MSc Cancer Biology
 - MSc Marine Science and Sustainable Development
 - MSc Artificial Intelligence in Finance
 - MSc Applications of Artificial Intelligence
 - MSc Financial Technology (Computer Science)
 - MSc Intelligent Systems and Robotics
 - MSc Data Science and its Applications
- Only one scholarship award can be made per student and the award cannot normally be held in conjunction with other University of Essex awards.

Students who are not eligible

The following students are NOT eligible for this scholarship regardless of meeting the above criteria:

- Students undertaking courses at East 15 Acting School.
- Students who are fully or partly sponsored
- These scholarship awards do not apply to deferred entry. Where a scholarship has been awarded to a student who subsequently defers entry to the following academic year, the award will be withdrawn, and the applicant will be considered again in line with the terms and conditions that apply in the new proposed year of entry.
- Students who are not assessed as paying overseas fees.

Payment arrangements

- These scholarships will only be made available as a reduction on the tuition fee that is payable on registration at the University. Payments will be made by stipend via a bank transfer. Please note payment cannot be offset against a tuition fee deposit if one is required.
- If you intermit from your course, you may, at the discretion of the University, be entitled to a prorata payment of the remainder of your award on your return to study. Please contact the <u>Funding</u> <u>Team</u> for further information.
